Conclusions from the conducted monitoring of the measures within the Government program 2021-2024 for the period October 2020-March 2021


Sixteen community mobilizers within the "Support to electoral reforms" project in the period October 2020 – March 2021 monitored the fulfilment of the promises of the political parties given in the preelection period within the election program, i.e. then transferred within the Government Program 2021-2024. The monitoring was conducted in six areas: economy, culture, justice, social issues, health and education and covered 16 sets of measures whose implementation was monitored in the named period. In addition are given the results of the monitoring and conclusions on the progress by areas and within the monitored measures. The monitoring is conducted according to the established methods of data collection such as desktop analysis, interviews, surveys and sending requests for public information to institutions. The results and findings are presented based on the material that the mobilizers managed to collect and which was made available to them. Therefore, we do not rule out the possibility that some measures may differ between the findings of the mobilizers and the current factual situation.

• Comparison of the progress by areas

In four of the six areas that are subject to monitoring there is moving or partial progress in achieving the projected measures that are monitored as shown in Chart 1. Progress has been made in the areas of economy, justice, health and education, with the most significant progress in the implementation of the measures subject to monitoring in the area of education and health. The area of social issues has made very little progress while the area of culture has not made any progress as no activities related to the measures subjected to monitoring have been initiated. It should be noted that in these two areas it was a challenge to provide accurate and up-to-date data regarding the monitored measures.


The scale of progress is defined as follows:

- 1-1.5 has no progress and is marked red
- 1.6-2.5 movement or partial progress
- 2.6-3 continuous progress or achievement



• Comparison of the progress of areas, by quarters

Compared to the monitoring quarters in the first quarter, the most progress was registered in the areas of economy, education and health, while the least progress was registered in the area of justice as shown in Chart no2. Between quarters, most progress has been made in the areas of justice and education.



• Comparison of the progress by measures, by quarters

In continuation of Chart no.3 shows the progress of measures within the six areas. The most progress between quarters can be seen in the measures in the areas of Justice and Education, especially the part of digital education. Some measures in the social field show a decrease in progress, partially due to the unavailability of information on specific measures, but also due to developments in the context and impact of the pandemic with Covid-19, which to some extent limited the full implementation of the measures.
